Build This House Part 2 "Imagine The Possibilities"

Message Recap

Faith requires us as believers to see things as they will be, not how they are. Faith looks at the possibilities, even when they go against all of the probabilities. When we are able to see with spiritual eyes, not physical eyes, we begin to live a life of faith. Faith is based in part on our imagination. Children have wonderful imaginations and are able to see things in their minds that adults struggle to see. As we get older, we tend to become less imaginative and more analytical, looking at facts and life experiences to inform our decisions. But Jesus tells his disciples in Matthew 18:3, *"Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven"*. This child-like faith is what He is looking for. It is the ability to imagine and believe that whatever God said, *is* possible and *will* happen.

Sometimes, we can become stuck in our thinking, and our faith suffers. Occasionally, we need to leave our current location in order to see what God has for us from a new perspective. Abraham was stuck in a season of hopelessness, having no children to carry on his legacy. But God gave him a vision and asked him to leave where he was in order to change his perspective. Abraham acted in faith, and because of that, he was able to *see* His promises, not only for himself, but for the thousands of generations to come. Our faith has a purpose-not to hoard the blessings God gives, but to bless those around us and across the earth.

Luke 18:1-8

Then Jesus told his disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up. 2 He said: "In a certain town there was a judge who neither feared God nor cared what people thought. 3 And there was a widow in that town who kept coming to him with the plea, 'Grant me justice against my adversary.'

4 "For some time he refused. But finally he said to himself, 'Even though I don't fear God or care what people think, 5 yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually come and attack me!'"
