Key Passage: 1Sa 14:6 NIV - 6 Jonathan said to his young armor-bearer, "Come, let's go over to the outpost of those uncircumcised men. **Perhaps the LORD will act in our behalf.** Nothing can hinder the LORD from saving, whether by many or by few."

Introduction: Both fear and faith involve believing in something we cannot see. Both ask the question "What if...". Jonathan chose to believe the Lord was with him. We can choose to move from fear to faith.

Jonathan asked the faith question: "What would happen if God was on our side?" (paraphrase) 1Sa 14:6 NIV – 6 "...Perhaps the LORD will act in our behalf..."

Three steps to Move from Fear to Faith

1. Visualize the Victory before you see it and don't be anxious for anything.

Heb 11:1 KJV - 1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, **the evidence of things not seen.** Phl 4:6 NKJV - 6 Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God;

2. Vocalize your Victory. Say it before you see it.

Isa 54:1 NIV - 1 "Sing, barren woman, you who never bore a child; burst into song, shout for joy, you who were never in labor; because more are the children of the desolate woman than of her who has a husband," says the LORD.

Joe 3:10 KJV – 10 ... let the weak say, "I [am] strong."

3. Mobilize your Victory. Move towards it. (God moved only after Jonathan moved.)

1Sa 14:8, 23 KJV - 8 Then said Jonathan, Behold, we will pass over unto [these] men, ... 23 So the LORD saved Israel that day: and the battle passed over unto Bethaven.
