Restore the Roar

In this lesson you will learn about the power we can find in Jesus.

Intro: Jesus is called in the Bible, the lion of the tribe of Judah. The lion represents strength, boldness, leadership, and kingship. Our courage, strength, and power does not come from our own ideas, economy, or government, it comes from our trust in Him. When you know who you are, you are able to walk in confidence and authority over any lie, distraction, or temptation of the enemy. You are unstoppable when you truly know your identity. Once we recognize who we belong to as children of God, we can operate in this life effectively in our God given confidence and authority.

I. Jesus is Power

A. The greatest source of power in the universe is God. Jesus is God. The bible makes it clear that God the Father and Jesus the Son are one (John 10:30). Once Jesus was raised from the dead, He came back with all power and authority in his hands. That same power that raised Jesus from the dead is in you. It's time to tap back into the power source. Jesus said he is the resurrection and the life. All the power you could ever want or need resides in you as a child of God.

II. Power in the name of Jesus

A. The name of Jesus is the name above all other names. Because Jesus was obedient even to the point of death on the cross, God gave him the most powerful name in history. At the name of Jesus, the demons tremble and flee. At the name of Jesus, we can speak to storms and winds and command peace. We can ask anything from God the Father in the name of Jesus and find acceptance. In Jesus name we can lay hands on the sick, and they will recover (Mark 16:17-18).

III. Jesus Throughout the Bible

A. In Genesis, Jesus is the seed of the woman promised to bruise the enemy. In Exodus, he is the Passover Lamb and the deliverer out of slavery. In Joshua, he is the captain of our salvation. In Nehemiah, he is the rebuilder of broken walls. In Proverbs, he is the wisdom of God. In Amos he is called the burden bearer. In Mark, he is the wonder worker. In Romans he is described as the justifier. In Philippians he is the God who meets our every need. In Titus he is the faithful pastor. In Revelation he is the King of Kings (Rev 19:16).
